

Calhoun County Commissioner of Licenses Barry E. Robertson is please to announce the implementation of a new state-of-the-art Licensing & Registration Application. The new system will offer a more efficient and innovative service to the registration process. As part of the transition, renewal notices received in the mail will now have a different appearance, as multiple vehicles will appear on one notice-which not only decreases waste but places all renewal information in one location. The new notices will be contained in a perforated envelope which will conceal the owner's personal information. The new system features: Web-based software, integrated document scanning, customer-facing displays and electronic signatures, as well as, comprehensive reporting and distribution capabilities; resulting in saved time, reduced errors and faster processing.



GOT A STAR ★ ON YOUR LICENSE? IT WILL BE REQUIRED TO FLY IN 2020



Starting next year, commercial travelers will be required to have a REAL ID-compliant driver's license (STAR ID) or another form of identification for domestic air travel. The new rule applies to every traveler 18 years of age or older, beginning October 2020. STAR IDs are issued to qualified individuals only at Alabama Law Enforcement Agency Driver License exam offices. Calhoun County will continue to provide renewals/duplicates for license, ID cards, and STAR ID's. Once the REAL ID Act goes into effect a valid U.S. passport or Star ID will be needed to board commercial aircraft for domestic flights or enter certain regulated federal facilities.

STOP CURBSTONING

Anniston - A new law will make it illegal to sell multiple cars on the side of the road without the proper licensing. Representative Randy Wood introduced legislation that states no person other than a motor vehicle dealer may sell a motor vehicle without being currently recorded as the owner or lienholder on the Certificate of Title. The new law also creates a master dealer license as well as changes the penalties and fees for non-compliance and offers further requirements for conducting off-site sales of automobiles. Commissioner Robertson has been working with Rep. Wood and a State Task Force ensuring the strengthening of consumer protection from potential curbstoners. Robertson says that "Consumers are at risk due to the seller providing illegal or incomplete paperwork and/or a salvaged title." Curbstoners also sell vehicles under the pretense of being the owner in order to evade paying state and local taxes.
